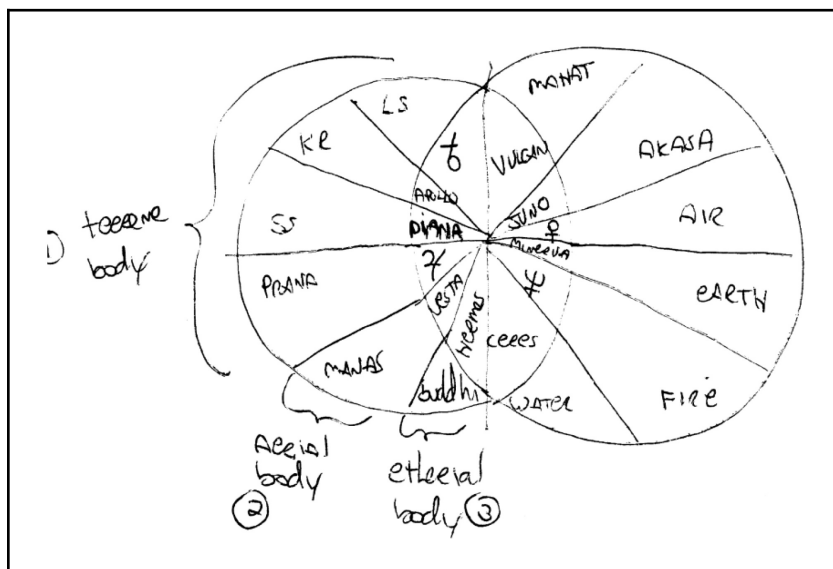

Intemperate love -- lower irrational desire, of the soul for the body -- lowest kind of love, is spoken of by Lysius.

Mania - inspiration: that which comes to the soul from beyond.

The primary definition of the soul as self-motive is equivalent to saying that the soul is life.
